JAMBOREE VISITORS

Jamboree Visitors get to experience a taste of the Jamboree in the Walter Scott Summit Center. This area features exhibits, activities, and smaller versions of some of the Summit's Adventure Zone venues.

Tickets may be purchased in advance, which will speed your processing through the welcome center

Ticket options include: observer or participant; single or multi-day passes; and show day passes.



Children under 6 are free; Youth are 6 to 10 years old; and 11+ adults

RUBY WELCOME CENTER



All visitors and council VIPs arrive and park at the J.W. & Hazel Ruby West Virginia Welcome Center located on SR19.



Visitors travel by Shuttle from the Welcome Center to the Jamboree site.

RUBY WELCOME CENTER



Shuttles between the Ruby Welcome Center and Jamboree's Gateway Village run throughout the day with the last shuttle departing to Gateway Village two hours before the posted closing time each day.



WHAT TO EXPECT

- Park in the designated lot at the Ruby Welcome Center. Signs and volunteers will direct you to the correct location.
- Proceed to the Visitor Check-in. For those who have purchased tickets in advance, you will scan your ticket, complete your waiver and proceed to the bag screening area.
- All bags will be screened before getting on the bus.
- Once on the bus, visitors will receive a brief overview of BSA's Youth Protection Guidelines.

Things to Remember...

- The Troop Assistance Program (TAP), that encourages council approved adult leaders to help support areas where staff members are needed in various areas at the Jamboree, was launched earlier this month. - By April 1, each unit register one designated Food Coordinator at
 https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/JamboFoodCoord . Traditionally the 2nd Assistant
 Scoutmaster/Associate Advisor, this person will be issued the primary user credentials for the online menu-planning tool, as well as the SwiftShopper App for your troop.
- An e-mail was sent on March 3rd regarding the Jamboree rafting process. There is a link to a google form where you can input your unit numbers and how many rafters are in each. We asked that this be completed by March 17th. If you have any questions about this process or need the link resent e-mail David.Kopsa@Scouting.org. Contingents with 0 rafters were not sent this e-mail.



Things to Remember...

- <u>Jamboree AHMRs submitted on or prior to April 19, 2017 will be processed before the Jamboree</u>. Jamboree AHMRs submitted after April 19, 2017 will be accepted and processed as soon as possible, but submission after April 19, 2017 may result in a significant slow down for the individual and/or their Unit at on-site registration until the individual's AHMR is cleared.
- A Jamboree troop number must be assigned to each contingent member before their medical can be processed and reviewed by the Jamboree medical staff.
 Please complete this process in the system as soon as possible and on a regular basis moving forward.
