Outdoor Ethics Advocate Workshop

June 18 – 24, 2017

This conference provides guidance to council volunteers and professionals on implementing the BSA's Outdoor Ethics program in the local council. Representatives from the BSA Leave No Trace task force and successful council outdoor ethics advocates will serve as the faculty for this conference.

Council Commissioner's Retreat

June 23 – 25, 2017
