About The Summit Bechtel Family National Scout Reserve

Located near the New River Gorge National River and Appalachian Mountains in West Virginia, the 14,000+ acre Summit Bechtel Reserve (SBR) is one of four facilities managed by the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America (BSA). It is home to the Paul R. Christen National High Adventure Base, the James C. Justice National Scout Camp, the John D. Tickle National Training and Leadership Center and serves as the permanent site of BSA's National Scout jamborees. There are six subcamps, which together have the capacity to house up to 40,000 campers at one time; a lake at the center of the main site, which separates the camps from the arena, transportation centers and adventure areas; and a valley that separates the western and eastern parts of the core property areas, which is connected by an 800-foot, triple-walkway pedestrian suspension bridge sponsored by CONSOL Energy.

SBR's adventure areas include: The Park (skateboarding); The Trax (BMX); The Pools (scuba & swimming); The Cloud (STEM); The Bows (archery); The Barrels (shooting sports); The Ropes (tree-based challenge courses); The Rocks (Climbing, Bouldering and Repelling); The Zip (zipline); Low & High Gear (mountain biking with +36 miles of downhill and cross country terrain); and The Canopy (canopy tours).

In addition to hosting BSA's 2017 National Jamboree, the Summit has been chosen as the site for the World Scout Jamboree in 2019, which is the first time this event has come to North America since 1983.

John D. Tickle National Training & Leadership Center

The Tickle National Training and Leadership Center supports local council, district and unit Scouters who want high-quality, immersive learning experiences conducted by experienced Scouting volunteers and professionals.

Current offerings include topics such as science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) for both youth and adults and National Advanced Youth Leadership Experience (NAYLE), where Scouts and Venturers can enhance their leadership skills through team building, ethical decision-making, problem solving and service to others.
