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2013 to 2017

- The 2013 National Scout Jamboree was the first to feature The Messengers of Peace Day of Service (MOPDOS) as part of the program.
- Over 148,000 hours of service were delivered in the 9 counties surrounding The Summit.
- In 2017 we will be back in those same counties and more...
- New For 2017: Pre-Jamboree Projects
- With the Huge Success of the 2013 MOPDOS for 2017 we are introducing the option of performing a Pre-Jamboree Project.
- This will allow the impact of Scouting's service to spread throughout the state of WV.

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MOPDOS DURING THE 2017NSJ



- Project dates during the Jamboree: July 20th, 21st, 24th, 25th and 26th.
- Will be scheduled by unit and will not conflict with other scheduled activities at the Jamboree. (Rafting, GGM and STEMQuest.)
- Troops will be transported by bus to the project. Troops will travel no further than 60 minutes from the Summit Site.
- Projects will be performed in 9 counties surrounding the Summit.
- Projects will be roughly 5 hours in length.
- Troops will find out their project location on the day of their project when they arrive at the Summit Center to board their bus.
- Busses will be given GPS trackers so The Summit Operation Center can track their location.



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PRE-JAMBO SERVICE PROJECTS

In 2017 the Jamboree will look to spread the impact of the Messengers of Peace Day of Service further out in West Virginia by organizing Pre-Jamboree Projects.

- No more than 15% of the total Jamboree Participants will be scheduled for pre-Jamboree projects.
- Projects to be performed on July 18th.
- Contingents will not be scheduled for pre-Jamboree projects unless they indicate to the Jamboree that they are interested via the pre-Jamboree Project interest form.
- We are hoping to do 1 project in each county.
- Projects will be able to handle contingents of 2 and in some cases 3 troops.
- Contingents larger than 3 units will need to do their projects during the Jamboree event.
- We will not split contingents into projects in different counties.



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Messengers of Peace Day of Service Pre-Jamboree Project Interest Form

In 2013 the BSA National Jamboree included a new program event called the Messengers of Peace Day of Service. Each Scout Troop and Venture crew spent one day performing valuable service in the 9 counties that surround The Summit. This program was as meaningful (if not more) to the Scouts who delivered the service as it was for the community that benefitted from the service.

As a result of that success we want to increase the impact by performing service throughout the entire state of West Virginia. The plan for the 2017 Jamboree is to provide service to the 9 counties that immediately surround The Summit during the Jamboree. Service projects in the remaining counties will be performed by Scouts as they travel to the Jamboree. Regarding the pre-Jamboree projects the exact specifics, projects, etc. have not been finalized but the following is our goal.

- Contingent Size:** These pre-Jamboree projects will be able to serve 2 and in some cases 3 Jamboree Troops of 40 participants. Larger contingents will need to take part in the Messengers of Peace Day of Service during the Jamboree.
- Maximum Number of Participants:** No more than 15% of the total Jamboree participants will be allowed to perform pre-Jamboree projects. This is the amount we feel we can plan and prepare projects for.
- Project Date:** The majority of projects will be performed on July 18th, the day prior to the Jamboree. We have a limited ability to perform projects on July 17th. If your contingent is interested in doing your project the 17th indicate so in the "Additional Comments" section of the interest form.
- Post-Jamboree Projects:** While we do not anticipate most groups travel logistics would allow for performing projects after the Jamboree we will have a very limited capacity to do some post-Jamboree Projects. If your contingent is interested indicate so in the "Additional Comments" section of the interest form.
- Housing & Food:** For the majority of projects lodging on the night of the 17th and 18th will be provided at no cost to contingents doing pre-Jamboree projects. This will be simple lodging options like a high school gym. Participants should bring a sleeping pad. 4 meals will also be provided at no cost to the troops, breakfast, lunch, dinner on the 18th and breakfast the morning of the 19th. A small portion of the projects we are partnering with West Virginia University on can provide at a cost higher quality housing accommodations and fun evening programming. Lodging and meals would be for the same dates and meals indicated above. If you are interested in this additional cost option indicate so on the interest form. (WVU Option \$95.00 per person no linens on beds. \$110.00 per person No linens.)
- Method of Travel:** We are targeting Troops that are traveling to the Jamboree by bus.
- Interest Form:** **The interest form is due back by May 20, 2016.** It is important for us to see if we have more interest or less interest than our 15% max.
- Project Assignment:** After reviewing the interest forms we will notify contingents by August if they are approved for a pre-Jamboree project. Specific pre-Jamboree project information will be delivered to councils by March 2017. We will place you on a project proximate to your route to the Summit. Once we have the projects finalized we will establish communication between the troop/crew and the project leaders to better prepare the troop/crew for the experience.

PRE-JAMBO SERVICE PROJECT INTEREST FORM

- Contingents interested in a Pre-Jamboree Service Project should fill out the form and return to 2017Jamboree@Scouting.org no later than May 20, 2016.
- After interest forms have been received the Jamboree will determine if the level of interest is less than or greater than our 15% Maximum.
- In August 2016 contingents will be notified if they will be scheduled for a Pre-Jamboree Project.
- Project location and other details will be distributed to units in Spring of 2017.



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PRE-JAMBO SERVICE PROJECT HOUSING & FOOD

For most of the projects, housing and food will be provided at no cost.

- Housing will be for the night of the 17th and 18th.
- Housing will be simple options like a high school gym or recreational center. Participants will need their sleeping pad and sleeping bag.
- Meals provided will be Breakfast, Lunch and Dinner on the 18th and breakfast on the 19th.

West Virginia University

- WVU is coordinating projects in 5 counties in Northern West Virginia.
- WVU can provide higher quality housing options and additional program (pool and rec center) for an additional cost. (Same housing dates and number of meals.)
- \$95.00 per person without linens and \$110.00 with linens.
- Groups will only be scheduled for this option if they indicate they are interested in it on the interest form.



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EQUIPMENT-ALL PROJECTS

For projects prior to and during the Jamboree bring the following:

- Sturdy closed toed shoes
- Long Pants
- Long-sleeve shirt
- Rain Gear
- 2 quarts water (water will be available at the project sites but all participants should start with 2 quarts from The Summit)
- Day Pack
- Troop First Aid Kit
- Lunch (for participants who perform their service during the Jamboree)
