





EQUIPMENT & GEAR REGULATIONS

Safety Equipment and Gear Provided

The Summit provides all required program and safety equipment such as helmets, pads, PFDs, ear protection, harnesses, etc. Personal helmets are permitted for use after an inspection from staff.

Close Toed Shoes

All The Summit activities require closed toed shoes for participation and your safety.

Wheeled Sport Activities

The ideal shoe for these activities is a biking shoe, skateboard shoe, or low-rise tennis shoe with a thin sole. These types of footwear help reduce potential injury in these activities. Stiff and bulky hiking boots make control more difficult on a skateboard and bike.

Aquatics

Closed toed shoes are required for all aquatic activities. Please bring footwear that will be dedicated to being soaked for the week. For challenging water activities, a brief swim ability check may be required by staff for your safety.

Recommended Gear

You are welcome to bring your own belongings. However, we recommend that you have the following essentials. Keep in mind that summer lows reach temperatures of 60 (lower in May & October) and summer highs around 85. Walking & hiking shoes or boots (closed toe)

- Daypack
- Rain gear
- Jacket for cool nights
- Water bottles
- Hat or cap
- Flashlight
- Long pants
- Sunscreen
- Insect repellent

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The Summit Operations Center [SOC] (304-465-2900)

For any <u>emergency</u>, please contact **The Summit Operations Center (SOC).** 911 is also an option in case of a medical emergency. Inform the 911 dispatcher that your location is - The Summit Bechtel Reserve.

Food & Waste

Our food and waste policies help reduce wildlife attraction to your camp. Please follow these policies. If property damage is found due to not following these policies. Refer to our Damage Policy for details on fines and evictions.

- All food not being consumed or prepared are to be sealed in airtight containers and remain in a refrigerator, cooler, or car. NO UNSEALED food is to be left in your lodging.
- Storage containers holding food must be placed at the corner entrance of your lodging.
- Other smellable items such as hygiene products must be sealed when not in use.
- All trash must be deposed into large dumpsters.
- Unsealed food must NOT be left unattended.

Emergency Procedures & Shelters

In the event of an incident or condition in which it becomes necessary to relocate, please follow staff instructions and proceed to designated Emergency Assembly Areas:

- Program area pavilions or dining halls.
- Scott Visitor Center back porch.
- If hiking, proceed in the safest route to the nearest program area, base camp, or Scott Visitor Center.
- If you are unsure call The Summit Operations Center 304-465-2900 for instructions. This is a 24/7 line.

Tent Safety

All flames are prohibited from inside tents; including but not limited to, candles, incense, essentials oils, or any form of vaporizing/smoke producing item. A fine will be accessed and a guest is subject to eviction with no refunds. Only 1 heater is allowed per tent, only the heater should be plugged into the outlet, no other electronics plugged in.

Tents are equipped with smoke detectors and fire extinguishers

Fire Safety

All fires MUST be within an approved Summit Fire pit. Fire pits in FAC are to be placed on top of a rock/gravel ground to follow LNT principles and reduce grass and soil damage.

Road Safety & Speed

All visitors are to obey all speed limits and stay in designated travel roads and parking lots. Safety is our priority with all visitors to the Summit. Violators are subject to eviction without refund.

Buddy System

Family members should always travel with a buddy. Two adults (one at least 21+) should always be maintained when youth and adults are hiking together.

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Water Intake Guide

Our camp wide PA system will announce heat conditions according to a color code. In addition, The Summit Health Lodge will fly a flag of this color. We <u>highly encourage</u> drinking 1 liter an hour during activities.

- GREEN Temperature Range: 85 degrees or less. \(\frac{1}{2} \) quart per hour
- YELLOW Temperature Range: 85 88 degrees. ½ to ¾ quart per hour
- RED Temperature Range: 88 to 90 degrees ³/₄ to 1 quart per hour.
- **BLACK** Temperature Range: Greater than 90 degrees 1 to 1 ¹/₄ quart/ hour.

Wildlife

<u>DO NOT FEED OR TOUCH ANIMALS.</u> We respect and reduce the risk of animal encounters by making ourselves and our base less approachable to them. Contact the SOC if wildlife encroaches in your campsites or if they pose a threat to your family. The following wildlife are dangerous and should ALWAYS BE AVOIDED.



Lightning Advisory

- Lightning advisories are announced when lighting is detected within 12 miles of The Summit.
- All Aquatics and Aerial Sports activities are suspended: All staff and participants exit the water or descend from their aerial sports activity and move to a safe location.
- **Consol Energy Bridge:** The wingtip walkways are CLOSED. The main wooden walkway is open.

Lightning Alert

- Lighting alerts are announced when lightning is detected within <u>8 miles</u> of The Summit.
- All outdoor activities suspended. All staff and participants must move to a safe location.
- The entire Consol Energy Bridge is closed under a lightning alert.

Wait until **ALL CLEAR** is announced before resuming activity.

If you are unable to get to appropriate shelter:



- Avoid open fields, ridge tops, tall and isolated objects.
- **Spread out** 10 feet between individuals.
- **Don't lie down as** nearby lighting strikes can pass through your body more easily.
- **Crouch low** and on the balls of your feet like a baseball catcher so you are not the tallest object around. At the same time keep your feet close together with your heels touching. This reduces the surface area of your body and the risk of electricity traveling through your vital organs.
- Cover your ears to help minimize hearing loss from loud thunder.
- **Beware of hair standing on end or skin tingling** as these can be signs of imminent strikes. Get into the crouching position immediately if you feel them (but be aware that lightning may strike without these warnings).

Emergency Locations

The Mountains of West Virginia have quick own setting weather conditions. We continually monitor the weather and will announce hazardous weather over our camp wide PA system. Please follow staff instructions in case of hazardous weather. If the severity of the storm warrants, the SOC will coordinate movement of all personnel to more secure locations. Transportation services will be utilized in extended periods of severe weather. If an emergency weather alert is announced, please seek appropriate weather shelters.

- Any permanent structure with supported roofing
- Shower houses
- Emergency Procedure Shelters
- Note: Unless directed by staff, the main living area of Luxury Deluxe Tents satisfy weather shelters.



To cancel reservations or activities before you arrive, please send an email to summit.program@scouting.org. Cancellation requests before arrival or during your stay must be submitted in writing.

All refunds are subject to the discretion of the FAC Director.

1) Cancellations

- a) Reservations cancelled within 0-14 days before arrival date do NOT receive a refund. If cancelled 15+ days before arrival date a full refund minus a 2.5% administration fee is applied.
- b) Additional buy-up activities, supplies, or meal plans cancelled within 0-6 days before arrival date or during stay do NOT receive a refund. If cancelled 7+ days before arrival date. A full refund will be applied respectively.

2) Premium Activities (During Stay)

- a) If <u>inclement weather</u> prevents you from partaking in a premium activity you could be subject to a full activity refund if the following apply.
 - i) All options were exhausted to reschedule your activity for a later date/time.
 - ii) There are no more available times for the activity for the remainder of your stay.
 - iii) The family chooses to not return on another date to use their premium activity.
- b) If <u>medical restrictions</u> prevent you from partaking in a premium activity you could be subject to a partial refund upon discussion with the FAC Director and Medical Team Staff.
- c) If <u>participation restrictions</u> prevent you from partaking in a premium activity you could be subject to a partial refund upon discussion with the FAC Director and Program Specialty Staff. The ability to refund will be subject to the following:
 - i) Program specialty staff consideration of risk mitigation; including assessment of physical ability and mental comprehension.
 - ii) Exhaustive options to provide a 'modified activity'; GRANTED If the individual falls within the parameters of age and weight restrictions.
- d) If <u>age restrictions</u> prevent you from partaking in a premium activity. No refund will be given. EXCEPT in the likelihood a reservation error was made for the wrong age group. Given a proven age as listed on a BSA medical form A/B.

3) Adventure Passes (During Stay)

- a) If <u>inclement weather</u> prevents you from partaking in ALL activities included with your pass for the entirety of your stay (minimum of 3 nights for Ultimate passes). You are subject to a full refund or prorated amount per activity.
 - i) You are NOT subject to a full refund if your stay is less than 3 nights (Ultimate only). INSTEAD, a 35% refund is applicable if there was at least 1 day available to partake in activities. If weather prevents activity for the entirety of your less than 3-night stay, you are subject to a 75% refund or prorated value amount per activity.
- b) If <u>medical restrictions</u> prevent you from partaking in activities, you could be subject to a partial refund upon discussion with the FAC Director and Medical Team Staff.
- c) If <u>participation restrictions</u> prevent you from partaking in more than half of the available activities, you could be subject to a partial refund upon discussion with the FAC Director and Program Specialty Staff.
 - i) Refer to 'Premium Activities (During stay)' clause for details.
- d) If age restrictions prevent you from partaking in activities refer to 'Premium Activities (During stay) Clause'.

FAMILY ADVENTURE CAMP POLICIES / CAMP RULES

We strive to provide families with an exceptionally safe and friendly vacation experience. The following policies/rules have been established based on industry standards, management procedures, and our personal experiences at the Summit Bechtel Reserve. These policies/rules are considered a part of our reservation agreement with you. By signing your reservation, you agree to follow all our policies/rules, terms and conditions, and procedures. These policies/rules are presented here to help promote our family's safety and enjoyment. These policies/rules are subject to amend, modify, vary, or cancel at any time and without prior notice. Any modification to these policies/rules that occurs before your departure is considered a part of your reservation's agreement with us. Finally, all policies/rules and are at the discretion of the Family Adventure Camp Director and The Summit Bechtel Reserve Leadership Team.

Restricted Access

The Summit Bechtel Reserve has several venues which can be dangerous without proper supervision. Therefore, no program venues are to be used without the presence of a qualified SBR Area Director overseeing activities. If there is no staff present, DO NOT enter, use, climb, operate, or play on any program venues.

Right To Refuse Service

The Summit Bechtel Reserve holds the right to refuse service to anyone for any reason(s) that does not violate Federal or State laws. We will refuse to admit or refuse service or accommodation or may remove a person, without refund, who refuses to abide by the reasonable standards and policies. The Summit Bechtel Reserve will refuse service or evict a guest: for refusal to pay for accommodations, is under the influence of alcohol, drugs, or any other intoxicating substance and acts in a disorderly fashion as to disturb the peace of other guests; is unable to properly supervise their children at all times, seeks to the use the facility for an unlawful purpose; seeks to bring into our property: an unlawfully possessed firearm; or something, including an explosive or hazardous or toxic substance, that is unlawful to possess and that may be dangerous to other persons; destroys, damages, defaces, or threatens harm to property or guests; causes or permits persons to exceed the maximum allowable occupancy of room, refuses to abide by the reasonable standards or policies established by The Summit Bechtel Reserve.

Late Arrival Fee

\$100 is charged to guests that arrive 1 hour past the check-in window WITHOUT a 2-hour prior notice from check in close. \$100 is charged to guests that arrive 3 hours after the check-in window, regardless of advance notice. The FAC Director holds authority to waive this fee.

Pets

Only dogs are allowed as pets for Family Adventure Camp. All dogs must be leashed and remained picked up. A pet fee will be applied to your reservation.

Quiet Hours (11pm-6am)

Quite hours are from 11pm-6am. If you become aware of a disruptive guest, please contact a member of FAC staff immediately. Or contact the SOC (304-365-2900). Televisions, voices, or other devices must be always kept at a respectful low level. Please follow "Leave No Trace".

No visitors after 11:00PM, visitors must notify FAC Staff upon their arrival and complete a medical form A/B in addition to completing the FAC YPT standards. Visitors must be always accompanied by the registered guest. Visitors are not allowed to use guest amenities or participate in any activity. Visitors may use Wi-Fi. Guests are responsible for their visitors.

Maximum Occupancy

Lodging occupancies are based on maximum ability to comfortably sleep the stated amounts in addition to safety requirements. Children under the age of 2 that can sleep in cribs may be allowed to exceed the maximum. If you exceed the maximum number of guests allowed, you will be asked to reserve another accommodation or vacate FAC.

Lost & Found Policy:

The Summit Bechtel Reserve assumes no liability for misplaced, stolen, or damaged valuables or belongings. If you discover that you have left behind something of value to you, please call us immediately (304) 465-2800 and we will assist you. Lost & found items are held for fourteen (14) days while we attempt to contact the guest. If we are unable to contact with the listed information in that time frame. The unclaimed item(s) are thrown away, donated, or disposed of accordingly.

Returning Items

We will happily return your lost item(s) to you by United States Postal Service. Your reservation will be charged packaging and postage, plus a \$10.00 handling fee. The Summit Bechtel Reserve is not responsible for any item lost or misdirected during shipment by the United States Postal Service.

Park At Own Risk

Park in designated areas. All vehicles are parked at the risk of the owner. The Summit Bechtel Reserve shall not assume liability or responsibility for any vehicle, occupants, or contents while operated or parked on property.

Damages Or Tampering with Fire Detection Systems/Fire-Fighting Equipment:

The Summit Bechtel Reserve holds the right to take actions towards any guest or visitor found to have tampered or interfered with any detection equipment in lodging and/or structures, including detector heads in public areas, break glass points and fire extinguishers. Guests or visitors found to have tampered with any fire detection or fire-fighting equipment will be charged with any costs incurred by the property and will be evicted from the site. Depending on the severity of the guest actions, law enforcement may become involved at the Summit's discretion. Should the fact that firefighting or detection equipment had been tampered with come to light after the guest has departed, we reserve the right, and you hereby authorize us to charge your credit or debit according to our damage policies.

Damages and/or Theft of Property

You are liable for any damage howsoever caused (whether by the deliberate, negligent, or reckless act) to your lodgings or property caused by you or any person in your party whether or not staying at The Summit Bechtel Reserve. We reserve the right to retain your credit card and/or debit card details as presented on your reservation and charge or debit the credit /debit card such amounts as it shall in its sole discretion deem necessary to compensate or make good the cost or expenses incurred or suffered as a result of the aforesaid. Should this damage come to light after the guest has departed, we reserve the right and you hereby authorize us to charge your credit or debit card for any damage incurred to your lodging or property, including but not limited to property damage, missing or damaged items, smoking fee, cleaning fee, etc. We will make every effort to rectify any damage internally prior to contracting specialist to make the repairs, and therefore will make every effort to keep any costs that the guest would incur to a minimum.

Deep Cleaning Fees

Guests lodging found with waste strewn around recklessly, intense odors permeated into area, semi-permeant markings, in complete disorder, and/or "trashed" will be subject to a deep cleaning fee, administration fee and/or third-party fees.

Damages and/or Removals to Lodging, Furnishings, Fixtures, Equipment, Linens, and Alike

Damages or removals to lodgings, fixtures, furnishings, equipment, electronic equipment, towels, linens, blankets, and a like will incur a fee of 125% of full and new replacement value. Any damages to property, whether accidental or willful, is the responsibility of the registered guest for each lodging. Any costs associated with repairs and/or replacement will be charged to the credit card of the registered guest.

TOBACCO, ALCOHOL, & ILLEGAL SUBSTANCES

The following sections lay out the Boy Scouts of America's policies on Tobacco, Alcohol, and Drugs. These policies are meant to be taken very seriously.

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Violation of these policies may result in dismissal from camp, membership revocation, and/or legal action.

Tobacco

Use of all tobacco products; including but not limited too E-cigarettes, vaporizers, electronic nicotine delivery systems, chewing tobacco, and anything alike must be done out of sight of all youth participants in designated areas. Communicate with camp staff if you have any questions. Adults should support the attitude that they, as well as youth, are better off without tobacco in any form.

Alcohol

The use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances is not permitted at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members.

Guests that conduct themselves in a disorderly fashion produced by intoxication are subject to eviction, without refund.

Drugs

Illegal drugs, including the misuse of prescription drugs have absolutely no place on property. The misuse of drugs happens in all levels of our society. We may be confronted with the problem at any time; therefore, we need to understand the misuse of drugs and what can be done about the situation. See the Drug Enforcement Administration website (www.dea.gov/) for detailed information on controlled substances and their effects.

Medical Marijuana

Marijuana possession of any kind is illegal in the State of West Virginia.

Paul R. Christen National High Adventure Base

The Paul R. Christen High Adventure Base offers programming in two different areas or levels. <u>The Summit Experience</u>, and <u>Treks</u>. The Summit Experience is an introduction to on-site high adventure at The Summit Bechtel Reserve. Trek programs delve deep into the area of specialty for a full week-long experience in or around the New River Gorge National River.

James C. Justice National Scout Camp

The <u>Justice Scout Camp</u> is a week-long resident camp for Scout troops and Venturing Crews looking who are looking for challenging advancement opportunities, activity exploration, and Scouting traditions. The Scout Camp program is intended to build upon and supplement unit and local resident camp experiences and includes merit badge/ranger elective classes, open activity time, training courses, and camp-wide events within the Walter Scott Scouting Valley at the Summit Bechtel.

Thomas S. Monson Leadership Excellence Complex

The <u>Thomas S. Monson Leadership Excellence Complex</u> offers a variety of weeklong and weekend conferences targeted towards Scouters, experienced Scouts, and outside groups. These courses include Professional Development, Youth Development, Program Instructor Certifications, STEM, NAYLE, Leave No Trace, and much more. Facilities include the Rex W. Tillerson Leadership Center, J.W. Marriott Leadership Center, and John D. Tickle National Training & Leadership Center.
